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For patients who have had sedation

If you have had conscious sedation you may feel tired, dizzy or weak afterwards. You must have someone to collect you from the Endoscopy unit and stay with you for 24 hours. During the first 24 hours you must not:

- Drive
- Operate machinery
- Drink alcohol
- Take sleeping tablets
- Sign legal documents
- Look after young children and/or dependents alone

After your procedure

You may have a sore throat for a short time after the test. This is normal and should pass within 24 hours. You can eat and drink normally.

If you have had Botox therapy in very rare cases, the Botox solution may spread from the injection site. This could cause serious problems so you MUST seek urgent medical advice if you get any breathing difficulties, choking or worsening swallowing following the procedure.

You should attend your nearest accident and emergency department, taking with you a copy of your endoscopy report.

If you develop:

- Shortness of breath
- Swelling in the neck
- Chest pain
- High temperature
- Loose black stools

You may have been given a drug called Buscopan to relax the bowel. Very rarely this can cause acute glaucoma (pressure build-up in the eye) If you develop any eye pain or change in your vision, please seek immediate medical attention at the Accident and Emergency department.
