The requirements of the Freedom of Information Act 2000, Data Protection Act 1998 and Human Rights Act 1998 (Article 8 – the privacy right) are incorporated into the IG Framework.

The Criminal Justice and Immigration Act 2008, enacted in October 2008, created new and increased sanctions for the Information Commissioner, which includes the ability to impose heavy sanctions on any individual and/or organisation who deliberately or recklessly commit serious breaches of the Data Protection Act 1998, which includes loss of personal data. The maximum penalty is £500,00
