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You have been given sedation

Due to the lingering effects of the sedation used, it is important that you rest for the remainder of the day and that you have someone to stay with you overnight. It is also important that you do not drive, return to work, operate machinery, sign legal documents, work at heights, take sleeping tablets or drink alcohol for 24 hours afterwards.

After the test

If you are feeling well two hours after your procedure then you can have free fluids and you can eat after four hours. However, if there is any sign of pain you may need to avoid eating and drinking for longer and the nurse will advise you accordingly.

You may have a sore throat for a short time after the test, this is normal and should pass during the day, having cold drinks can ease this. You can eat and drink normally once you are home.

If you have any of the symptoms below you should attend your nearest Accident and Emergency department and take a copy of your report:

- severe chest pain
- severe tummy pain black stools
- bleeding from the back passage swelling in the neck
- shortness of breath high temperature feeling unwell
- eye pain or change in vision (Buscopan is sometimes given as part of ERCP).

If you have had a stent inserted and you find that after a period of time your urine becomes darker, you develop a temperature, have tummy pain or feel unwell it is possible that your stent may be blocked, and you should go to Accident & Emergency.
